It is always an amazing feeling to finish a magical and memorable summer at Skylake filled with new and deepened relationships with campers and staff. It's not long after experiencing this immense joy, that we turn our energy towards debriefing and evaluating the season to determine how we can always get better. Before we know it, we find ourselves opening enrollment on September 1st for the very next summer! We enjoy seeing an increase in inquiries at this time of year from new families who begin calling and emailing with questions about when sign up, and also hearing from returning camper families about their excitement to return. We have kept our timeline for Fall Enrollment pretty consistent over the last twenty-five or more seasons, with a Priority Enrollment period for returning families, followed by Open Enrollment for new families. It is important to us to be loyal to returning families to allow them time to enroll before their age group or session fills up, while also being fair and transparent with new families who are excited to send their child to camp.

It brings a smile to our faces to see all of these familiar names on applications streaming in during Priority Enrollment. It also brings us joy and anticipation to see the new siblings applying at this time. For the youngest age groups where we knew we would have the space and not fill up during priority enrollment, we were able to fit these new siblings in right away. For new siblings in the older age groups that can fill up during priority enrollment, we sometimes had to wait a little bit longer. We were thrilled to accommodate all of the new siblings who applied in these early months.

The processing of new camper family applications began on November 1st and there were over 100 applications pending for processing at that time. We had great success in finding availability for these new applicants who had been planning ahead and had this date on their calendar. Some families had to be flexible on their session preferences in some of the age groups that had filled up by the end of Priority Enrollment, but we found we were able to accommodate the majority of these early applicants and make everyone happy.

Applying in this initial enrollment period is the best way to get on our radar and secure a spot, even if it means starting out on a waitlist. We did start a few waitlists early in November in some of our age groups and sessions that have the highest demand. We work diligently throughout the year to manage our waitlists and fill spots when cancellations come in. We understand that not all parents are aware that many camps start enrolling this early. We work very hard to get families in who reach out later in the year and if not for the upcoming summer, we are ready to prioritize these families the following summer for a spot if they don't clear a waitlist.

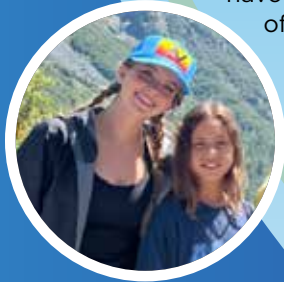
For those who find themselves on a waitlist at this time, it can be hard for us to make predictions, however we do see trends. We tend to see clusters of cancellations around the new year, and again before March 15th and then a few more just before summer. We ask families who are currently on wait lists to be patient. If a spot opens up, we will reach out to offer the spot, and we will make sure that we hear back from you before moving to the next camper on the list. We welcome you to check in for updates, and if your plans have changed and you no longer need to remain on our waitlists, it is helpful to us and others if you could please let us know.

Nicole has worked on the waterfront the past 4 summers, as a counselor, then head guard and as our Waterfront Director last summer. We are thrilled to have Nicole return in our senior level waterfront position. Of special note, Nicole followed in the footsteps of her older sister Ally Thoits who worked on the waterfront for a number of years, and was also our Waterfront Director for two years! Additionally, this summer the youngest of the Thoits siblings, Makayla Thoits who became a counselor last summer, will step into the position of Head Lifeguard this coming summer! All three Thoits siblings were former campers and are also second-generation campers. Gibson Bowles, who was an amazing part of our Trips Team last summer will take on the position of Head Boys this coming summer. Gibson could always be found shooting hoops with campers whenever he wasn't out on trips! Returning to the position of Head Trips will be Maeve Goble. Maeve was brand new to Skylake last summer but came with a wealth of knowledge on the outdoors and a strong attention to safety. She learned and grew a ton in this demanding role and is very excited to take on the position again with her gained knowledge about Skylake. We are finalizing Head Girls and Activity Director positions and hope to announce those staff members soon!



We have said this before and will continue to stress how important a staff position at Skylake is for the growth of our young leaders. Working at camp is not just fun and games. It is meaningful work that also provides opportunities to collaborate with a team, problem solve, and communicate effectively, all of which are great on a resume. Staff also benefit from expanded social connections and often establish valuable networking relationships.

Skylake provides staff with a week of staff training and then ongoing professional and development support throughout the summer. Our staff are an invaluable component of camp, and we see so much value in supporting their growth in leadership well beyond their time on site at camp to serve them well in their future careers.

During the off season we write numerous reference letters for former staff members speaking to the countless and varied skills that are developed and honed while doing the "job of a counselor". These skills are used daily at camp

and include; decision making, multi-tasking, creative problem solving, collaboration, communication, professionalism, integrity, time management, initiative, empathy, leadership and teamwork. Part of our joy as Directors, besides the obvious wonder and excitement we cultivate and grow with our campers, is working with these young adults. We guide them as they take on the massive responsibility of caring for our campers, and in the process, we witness huge personal growth while they develop and hone skills that they will take with them as they enter the work force.





ACA Accreditation & Why it is Important

Some may ask “What does it mean to be an ACA Accredited Camp”? We would love to share more of what this means, as Skylake is currently in an accreditation renewal year. At least every five years, **American Camp Association** Accredited camps must demonstrate compliance through an on-site visit. We will welcome this visit to camp during operations this summer to demonstrate our work in meeting and in some areas exceeding these standards for accreditation.

ACA Accreditation means that camps who are accredited undergo a thorough review of its operation (up to 290 standards) ranging from staff qualifications and training to emergency management. American Camp Association collaborates with experts from the American Academy of Pediatrics, the American Red Cross, and other youth-serving agencies to assure that current practices at the camp reflect the most up-to-date, research-based standards in camp operation. Camps and the American Camp Association form a partnership that promotes summers of growth and fun in an environment committed to safety.

The American Camp Association is the only nationwide accrediting organization for all types and designs of organized camps. ACA standards focus on health, safety, and risk management practices. The Accreditation program is more than just the on-site visit. In non-visit years there is also a focus on continuous compliance with the standards. This allows for ongoing emphasis on quality improvement throughout the entire accreditation cycle. In non-visit years, camps must demonstrate their compliance with accreditation standards by submitting a narrative report called the Annual Accreditation Report.

The ACA accreditation process offers three primary purposes:

- 1. Accreditation educates camp owners and directors** in administering key aspects of camp operation, particularly those related to program quality and the health and safety of campers and staff. The camp's voluntary participation in the ACA's professional development and peer-review accreditation process demonstrates a commitment to providing the best possible camp experience.
- 2. Accreditation provides a framework** to manage resources, offer best practices in policies and procedures, and strive for continuous improvement. ACA standards establish guidelines for designing and implementing policies, procedures, and practices. The camp is then responsible for implementing those policies and ensuring they are followed.
- 3. Accreditation indicates to the public that the camp administration has voluntarily allowed a peer review process** in which its practices are compared to standards established by professionals and authoritative sources associated with the camp industry.

What's the difference between state licensing of camps and accreditation by ACA?

Accreditation is voluntary and ACA accreditation assures families that camps have made the commitment to a safe, nurturing environment for their children. Licensing is mandatory and requirements vary from state to state. ACA standards are recognized by courts of law and government regulators as the standards of the camp community.

How do ACA standards exceed state licensing requirements?

ACA goes beyond basic requirements for health, cleanliness, and food service into specific areas of programming, including camp staff from director through counselors, emergency management plans, health care, and management. ACA applies separate standards for activities such as waterfront, horseback riding, and adventure and travel. Some other examples of areas ACA standards focus on include staff to camper ratios and ensuring they are appropriate for different age groups, emergency transportation is available at all times, and First-aid facilities and trained staff are available when campers are present.

Skylake, along with other ACA Accredited camps have a lot of pride in taking part in this thorough review of operations, health and safety protocols, programs, staffing and facilities which demonstrates our commitment to providing a really fun camp where kids can learn and try new things in a safe and nurturing environment. We are currently in the process of reviewing and preparing all of our written materials for review by March, followed by the on-site demonstration of these standards in practice for our visitors scheduled during a typical day at camp this summer.

Los Angeles Fires Our Skylake Community Affected

On January 7th, 2025, Los Angeles faced the onset of what will go down as the most devastating fire event in California's history. What Los Angeles is experiencing is something unimaginable. Block after block of urban environment homes have been consumed by the wind fueled flames. The heart ache of so many homes now gone, families displaced, lives lost is overwhelming. The toll on these communities right now is beyond comprehension, but the stories of hope and rebuilding will be what these families will be turning to in the days that lie ahead. We understand the rebuilding will take a lot of time and will not be easy. Together we must all put our arms around these communities in the weeks, months and years that lie ahead and each support them in any way that we can.

Skylake has historically been a camp that serves all of California. Approximately 45% of our campers come from northern California and 45% come from southern California. A very significant number of our Los Angeles families are from the Pacific Palisades area which has been hit the hardest, along with a few families in Malibu, Altadena, Topanga and Sierra Madre which are other areas we know to have lost countless homes.

This article is being written just days after those homes were destroyed, fires are still active, and so many families are still evacuated and waiting to get back to see what remains of their homes and neighborhoods. The full extent of the impact of these fires on our Skylake families is still not fully known. From fire maps and zip codes, we estimate that as many as 30-45 of our currently enrolled campers have lost their homes completely or sustained major damage to their home in the most affected areas. And we know we have many Alumni families and recent campers in these areas as well.

Skylake is committed that every one of our campers that lost their home will be able to attend camp this summer at a significantly reduced expense. The early game plan is that Skylake will absorb and provide a 50% scholarship to every one of these campers. Once we know the full extent of how many families are in this situation, we will assess and have the goal to offer more for them.

Hopefully by the time you are reading this newsletter a very specific plan will be in place and we can in our own small way assist these families.





Professional Development & Conference Season

As Camp Directors, the “off season” is a great time to reflect on the past summer, plan for the next summer, and to grow our knowledge in child development topics as well as other areas of camp operations. It is of huge importance to us to continuously strive to be better and provide the best experience possible for families of today. One of our favorite conferences to attend is the Annual WAIC Conference (Western Association of Independent Camps). This group is made up of both day camps and residential camps who pay annual dues and take part in meetings, educational opportunities and special workgroups during the year. There is a Northern California, Southern California and Silver States Chapter to allow smaller groups to focus on specific legislation or regional impacts that apply to them more than camps in other regions. We all get together at the annual conference which was held in Del Mar this past November. We must admit that San Diego sunshine was pretty nice knowing winter was coming for us in the mountains! The conference provides educational workshops, general sessions, an annual meeting of members, a vendor tradeshow and most valuable in so many ways are the networking opportunities.

Summer Camps make up a very unique, small and connected industry. We all grow from these annual gatherings and learn so much from one another, listening to keynotes, sitting at a round table, or approaching another Director after a session to discuss how they approach specific topics that may have come up at camp that summer. It is a comfortable space where camps feel open to share both successes and struggles, so that we are all stronger as an industry and can support the growing needs of campers. These other camp directors have become our friends and we leave each other after the week feeling inspired and with a few new ideas on our to do list.

This year’s conference was particularly exciting as one of our very own Directors was elected to serve on the WAIC Board of Directors. After recently being nominated for the Vice President role of the Northern California Chapter, Adrienne was officially voted in and elected to serve in this position. It was unanimous within the group and Adrienne was honored to be selected and sworn in at the closing dinner event.

In February, Adrienne will attend the National American Camp Association (ACA) Conference in Dallas. The ACA Conference is a much larger conference which we like to attend the every few years, usually in years it is held in the West. With the first WAIC Board Meeting of the new term being held at the ACA Conference, Adrienne will be heading to Texas. She is looking forward to the trip and always excited about these professional development opportunities.
